SACRAMENTAL NEEDS

<u>Sacrament of Baptism:</u> Baptismal preparation is required for parents who desire their baby / child to be baptized. Parents must be registered with the church. Forms and information are available in the office.

<u>Sacrament of Penance:</u> Saturday 3:15 pm Sunday 9:15–9:45 am or upon request Domingo 12:00 pm Spanish

<u>Sacrament of the Sick:</u> If one is seriously ill or having surgery, call the parish office or the rectory for Anointing of the Sick/Last Rites by Fr. Julius. Funerals: When planning funerals, contact the office before finalizing arrangements.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: Notify the office for the homebound or hospitalized to request a visit from Fr. Julius, either for communion or for anointing of the sick.

<u>Sacrament of Marriage</u>: Couples should contact the Pastor a minimum of <u>six</u> (6) months in advance. Dates may <u>not</u> be set prior to the second meeting with the priest. The Diocese requires that couples attend an Engaged Encounter or Picture of Love Weekend.



F.L.A.M.E. Program E= Eucharist

The Greatest Eucharistic Miracle: During the celebration of the Holy Mass the ceiling opens and merges with Heaven and the participants experience the suspension of time as God is present always: past, present and future. We are actually present at Calvary as Jesus sacrifices Himself to atone for our sins. Jesus promises to be with us until the end of the age at His Ascension and accomplishes this through the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, Holy Communion. Jesus established this sacrament at the Last Supper: "This is My Body which will be given up for you...This is my Blood which...will be shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do This In Memory of Me." The greatest Eucharistic Miracle is repeated at every Mass celebrated every day all over the world. This Miracle of Transubstantiation occurs when, during the Mass the priest consecrates the earthly substance of bread and wine and it supernaturally becomes the TRUE PRESANCE of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ, the beloved Son of God.
